Adoption Credit and Adoption Assistance Programs/Internal Revenue Service

This is a federal tax credit for adoption. For the federal tax credit, the maximum amount (dollar limit) for 2023 is \$15,950 per child. Any credit in excess of your tax liability may be carried forward for up to five years. If you adopt a U.S. child that a state has determined to have special needs, you're generally eligible for the maximum amount of credit in the year of finality. A child has special needs for purpose of the adoption expenses if: A state determines that the child can't or shouldn't be returned to their parents' home.

Note: Be sure to use a tax professional that understands the federal tax credit. MSPCC recommends the Hadley office of H&R Block because one of their agents is an adoptive parent. Also check out this website https://www.mass.gov/guides/guardianship-and-adoption-what-are-the-differences

The group will meet on Monday evenings, 7 - 8:30 pm at First Congregational Church, 68 Main Street, Falmouth Village Green. A hybrid Zoom option is available during the in-person meeting. Each week a different Dialectical Behavioral Therapy skill is discussed, so new participants can join at any time. They use the book, DBT For Dummies (can be purchased on Amazon), and view videos created by Rutgers University: DBT in 5 Minutes or Less (available free on YouTube).
